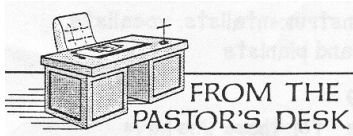

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

One day a space ship landed in the middle of a huge field just outside a small, rural Minnesota community. The aliens looked friendly enough, so some farmers approached them, hoping to establish a good relationship. The aliens greeted the earthlings warmly and said, “We are on a mission from the planet Zuron of the galaxy Andromeda. We have been assigned to explore your planet and to discover what you have learned. We are here to learn as much as we can about the planet earth and its people. So tell us, has anything significant happened here on earth that you can tell us about?”

The farmers thought for a moment and then one spoke up and said, “Well we have radio and TV to inform and keep us entertained. We witnessed Ari choosing Becca, then dump her for Lauren. He’s an idiot for dumping her, but now Becca is the new Bachelorette and doing her own picking. Television is pretty awesome! What did we ever do before radio and TV?”

“Really?” replied one of the aliens, “We’ve had that sort of stuff for thousands of years. In fact, that technology has become quite obsolete. What else has happened here?”

“Well that technology is kind of obsolete here, too,” said one of the farmers. “Now we’ve got computers, the internet, and cell phones. We can send signals all over the planet using satellites. I can even hop in my tractor, push a few of buttons and the tractor will practically drive itself! The next thing is self-driving cars! We’ve got some great technology.”

“Huh,” said one of the aliens, “that’s old news, too. Hasn’t anything extraordinary happened here?”

The farmers were still thinking when one of the aliens asked, “We have heard rumors that God visited your planet many years ago. Is that true?”

“Well,” replied a farmer, “there was a man named Jesus Christ. He claimed . . .”

“Yes! That’s it!” broke in one of the aliens. “Jesus Christ! Did he really come?” asked the alien excitedly.

“Yes,” said another farmer, “but . . .”

“What an extraordinary thing!” exclaimed the alien before the farmer could continue. “What a *wonderful* thing! Tell us, what did you do when God visited your planet? Did you bring gifts and throw them at his feet? Did you run through the streets celebrating and singing his praises? Did all your world finally realize how much God loves them? Please, tell us, what did you do?”

The farmers pondered for a moment and then sheepishly said, “Um . . . we, um, . . . we killed him.”

This story might bring a chuckle, but it also makes

us think, doesn’t it? It begs the question, “What am I, what are you, doing with Christ Jesus? Are we celebrating? Are we telling the world? Is Jesus alive in our lives? Are we enthusiastically living in God and for God?”

In some ways, maybe we are. But, tragically, in many other ways, we aren’t. If we were, I’m guessing the world would look and sound a lot different.

Instead of seeing hungry people or pictures of hungry people, all would be fed—study after study tells us we have enough food for all to be fed.

Instead of political parties spending tens and hundreds of millions of dollars on ads tearing down their opponents for a full six months (or more) leading up to an election every two years, tens and hundreds of millions, even billions of dollars would be going to solving real, but, also, manageable problems in our communities and nation and world.

Instead of our worshiping communities limping along just trying to make budget to stay open one more year, our ministries would be expanding to make life better not just for “our own,” but for all. To answer Cain’s question in Genesis, chapter 4, “Yes, we are our brother’s and our sister’s and our neighbor’s keeper. That’s how God has set it all up. God has created us and gifted us all in various ways that *together* we might, in our God-given and God-mandated creativity, work together to provide an environment where all might thrive.

Add your frustrations with the way things are and God’s preferred way things should be here.

So what can we do about it? First, it’s not about exercising control. That is fruitless, for we are never really in control. Rather, it’s about having the courage to surrender control--to allow God’s Holy Spirit to embrace us with God’s mercy and grace, and then lead us into an incredible future of love and hope and mutual caring.

Second, it’s not about survival of the fittest, but rather about the fittest survival (of us *all*)—a survival that allows all people the opportunity to thrive and rejoice, to sing of and celebrate God and the life that God gives. That can only happen when the immediate needs of all people are addressed and the walls and roadblocks that hinder some of these people are broken down.

¹⁸ *And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of **all** nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. Education: No Report.

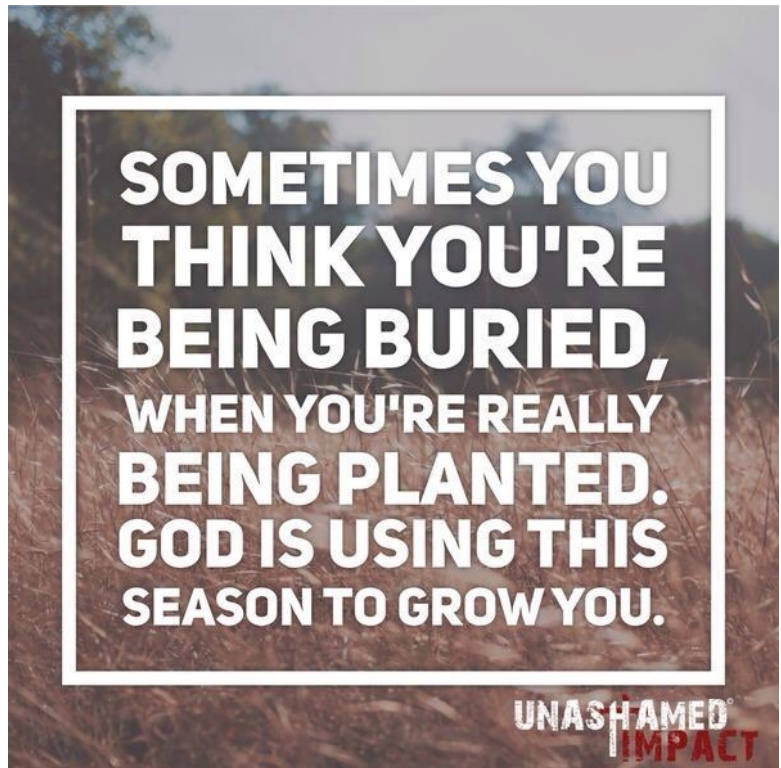
