Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

I have a friend who will be celebrating her 244<sup>th</sup> birthday in a few days. She's had quite a life. Needless to say, at 244 years of age she is not a person, but rather a nation.

I remember, as a kid, I loved celebrating the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. We'd be up early and stay up late. Our day would be full of firecrackers and bottle rockets, probably a picnic at Fort Lincoln State Park just south of town. We'd follow the trails through the park, toss a fishing line in the river, race up the hills to see who would be the first to make it to the block houses, climb their steep, scary stairs, and emerge on the open roof where you could see for miles and miles. Of course, the highlight of the day would always be the night which never seemed to come fast enough once it hit twilight. Our house was on the northern end of Mandan, just over the crest of a bluff overlooking most of the town. We'd pitch our lawn chairs in the front vard facing south. We'd sit down with chips and beverages, my dad and the neighbor couple each with a beer, my brother, grandmother and I each with a lemonade, and we'd wait. We'd wait for what seemed like ages for the light to fade from the sky just enough. The whole time my brother and I would ask the same question over and over, "When's it going to start? When's it going to start?" Finally, at about 10:40 pm we'd hear a distant boom or two and see a faint trail or two of white rising over the crest of the hill from the rodeo grounds far below—and then the sky in front of us exploded in the most wondrous display of colors and patterns. It was so awesome and lasted perhaps 20-30 minutes. Then, when it was finished, our eyelids heavy, my brother and I would head off to our beds, thinking we lived in a great place, in a perfect nation, and that all was well in the world.

A lot has changed since then. I'm nearly 50 years older, I've seen and experienced so much, and I'm not nearly so innocent in my outlook. Yes, I still believe we live in a great nation, but I know that it is far from perfect. I also know it never was perfect, and it probably never will be—because none of us are perfect. But this nation can and must be better.

Our forefathers imagined into being a new nation and helped pen and adopt an eloquent and profound Declaration of Independence 244 years ago—with words such as:

"the equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them . . ."

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, ...."

"with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other out Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Tragically, many of these men 244 years ago, who declared so eloquently and rightly their equality with their brothers across the sea, somehow had a blind eye to their brothers whose skin color was different than their own and to their sisters of any color—and we have been scarred individually and as a nation ever since.

As our Independence Day approaches many of us reflect on patriotism. Many of the patriotic images that flood our brains are of the men and women who have sacrificed so much (some even their lives) to serve in our armed forces over the years. I know I think of them and thank God for their courage and commitment. But, it seems to me, just as patriotic are those who have stood up and are standing up to the injustices in our nation and in our world. Just as patriotic are those who are calling us to live into the truths which we espouse in these founding documents of our nation.

The fact that there is so much unrest in our nation tells us that there is something wrong. Perhaps the greatest patriotism we can show is for all of us, whatever our skin color, gender, gender orientation, heritage, religion, or political party, etc. is to go out of our way to find someone different from us and sit down with them in true conversation—which means setting our agenda aside for a time to truly listen and empathize with that other person. Then, we can begin to share our experiences and why it is that we feel the way we do. Even with this, we have a long road ahead—but it is a start.

We can and we must be a better nation. And, while we will never be a perfect nation, we cannot be satisfied until every child, whatever their skin color, gender, orientation, heritage, religion, or political party can go to bed in their innocence thinking that he or she lives in a great place, in a perfect nation, and that all was well in the world.

New Life Lutheran Church Council met at 6:33 p.m. on June 10th, 2020 some met in the fellowship hall at NLLC in Rothsay, MN while others met via Zoom. Present were: Mike Heidecker, Jessi Christ, John Reber, Jessica Nelson, Steph Olson, Joyce Peterson, Randy Whitehead, Patrice Ziegler, Renae Froslie, and Gayla Western.

The meeting opened with devotions from Randy

- **1.0 Approval of Agenda:** John made a motion to approve the amended agenda, Joyce seconded it, motion carried.
- **2.0 Approval of May 2020 Council minutes:** Jessi made a motion to approve the minutes as amended from May 2020, Jessica seconded it, motion carried.
- **3.0 Treasurers Report:** Joyce made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, John seconded it, motion carried.
- 4.0 Ongoing Business:

**4.1 Technology update:** John stated that the transmitter purchased works well for services.

**4.2 Drive-in services:** John stated our first service went well, we learned the range of our microphones but no other issues. Randy suggests continuing with parking lot and online worship to keep those at risk safe. People are allowed to bring lawn chairs to attend services but will need to remain near their vehicles and wear masks, while continuing to stay 6 feet away from others. Patrice asked how many service group members are needed and the consensus is that 2 people will be needed, 1 for offering and possibly 1 for directing traffic to park.

**4.3 Parking lot:** Patrice found that the parking lot is covered under insurance; there is a \$1,000.00 deductible and possible increase in the following year's insurance premium, depending on the type of claim filed and price. Mike suggested Lorin get a few quotes to see what the cost would be to get the parking lot fixed.

#### 5.0 New Business

#### 5.1 Correspondence:

Email invite to Jess to attend a zoom meeting with Luthercrest to discuss their online/virtual options for camp this summer. They will be having virtual worship and bible camp that will be free for parents and children. Their programing will begin in July. Mike suggested Patrice get the information sent out via the Sharefaith app, website, and sign.

#### 5.2 Upcoming Events:

July 12<sup>th</sup> – Dante Joe March Baptism will be held outdoors. We do not have the staff and space to hold indoor events as of right now.

#### 5.3 Confirmation date changes:

Randy suggested changing the confirmation dates to late summer for the kids that would have been confirmed in May since we do not know what the future holds. It was recommended he check with parents to see what their thoughts are.

#### 6.0 Pastors Report:

Randy brought the keyboard and amplifier to Little Bethany for their outdoor service and it seemed to work well. Most

people remained in their cars while some brought lawn chairs and sat outside. He has also been working on the quilter's closet to add additional storage space. Little Bethany suggested ordering celebration single packed wafer and cup for communion, it is \$100.00 for a pack of 500. It was recommended by council that Randy order them.

#### 7.0 Youth Report:

Jessica stated during the Luthercrest Zoom they said most of their staff is working from home while others will go on site to quarantine for 2 weeks, then work for 2 weeks, and make the transition back to home. They are willing to give tips and tricks on how to do Sunday school and VBS virtually. They will be having a virtual VBS for grades K-5 and will separate them into groups by ages. Jess had her first no show Zoom youth group last Sunday. There will be an in person, outdoor, youth hangout this Sunday June 14<sup>th</sup> following the outdoor service for about 30 minutes. This will be outdoors with no more than 8 kids; they will wear masks and social distance.

# **Applying Bible Principles**

Someone once said, "Experience is a good teacher, but she gives the test first and then the lesson." That's certainly true, and based on many of life's experiences, we frequently fail the test before we can benefit from the lesson.

The formula "e equals mc<sup>2</sup>" is familiar to many college students but understood by very few people. Most of us know it had something to do with Einstein and was the formula that led to the release of enormous power and to the nuclear age. Similarly, in funding the local church, "e" might stand for every, "m" for member, "c" for commitment, and the "2" for the effort multiplied by itself. The fruit of that kind of effort is much more powerful than what Einstein discovered, even as Jesus described it in Matthew 21:22 — "Whatever you ask for in praver with faith, you will receive."

Right now, as we consider the opportunity to support the ministries here at Little Bethany & New Life Lutheran Churches, God is putting us to the test. As Gordon Moyes stated, "Responsible giving or stewardship is not man's way of raising money, but God's way of raising people. . . . The church's budget is not a list of its expenses, but a record of its vision. It is not a list of bills to be met, but a program of ministry to be achieved."

As each of us prayerfully considers what God would have us give, and as we obey what God asks of us, we can trust him to provide the resources. That's a test — a test of where we are spiritually much more than where we are financially. It's a test of us as individuals and of us as a church. The question is whether or not we really believe that God has the power and ability to bless our obedience "far more than all we can ask or imagine" (Eph. 3:20).

How are you doing concerning God's tests regarding money in your life? If God's provision in your life in the days ahead depends on how you obey his leading now concerning your giving, what will the future be like for you?

It just might, you know. . . .






