Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Grace and peace to you in the name of our gracious God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As I was preparing for this newsletter article, I began thinking to myself, "Okay, this is for the month of August; what should I write about? Thinking "August," my mind went naturally to St. Augustine. Probably like most of your minds would—or not. Augustine was a theologian and he served as the Bishop of Hippo (located in what is now known as the city Annaba in Algiers, on the northern coast of Africa) until his death in 430 AD. Over a thousand years later, Augustine would be one of Martin Luther's favorite theologians. As I thought about Augustine, a favorite quote from him popped into my head, as it probably did for you too—or not.

"Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in thee." [St. Augustine of Hippo]

Finding rest in this complicated world of ours is a challenge. One of the main roadblocks, I think, is our unease with ourselves and our failures and shortcomings in our relationship with God. Despite our best intentions we tend to have a penchant for chasing after worldly desires instead of embracing God's plans for us. In my case, I know it is only God's grace that frees me from the paralysis that results. Yes, the greatest roadblock to this much needed rest is my failure to abandon myself to God's grace. My failure complicates things, but it certainly doesn't stop God from being the gracious God he is. Maybe this true story says it better than my attempt to explain. . . .

When the first Christian missionaries arrived in Alberta, Canada, they were savagely opposed by a young chief of the Cree Nation, a man named Maskepetoon. However, over time and through persistent efforts, these missionaries made inroads, and Maskepetoon did respond favorably to the gospel. He eventually became a Christian. It was shortly after his conversion that a member of the Blackfoot tribe murdered Maskepetoon's father. Devastated by the loss, Maskepetoon rode into the village where the murderer lived and there he demanded that the murderer be brought before him. Confronting the guilty man, Maskepetoon shocked everyone, especially the murderer, when he said, "You have killed my father, so now you must be my father. You shall ride my best horse and wear my best clothes." In utter amazement and remorse his enemy exclaimed, "My son, now you have killed me!"

What the murderer meant, of course, was that the hate in his own heart had been completely erased by the unexpected forgiveness and kindness of Maskepetoon. This grace transformed his life. When we talk about God's grace, this is what we mean; it is forgiveness—a forgiveness that changes everything, a forgiveness that slays the old self and brings forth a new creation. This doesn't mean that the new creation is perfect; it is not. But this new creation is oriented toward and grounded in this new relationship with God that brings a rest that can only be found in God. It is a rest that can and does renew us and give us the courage to rise again to face each new day and each new challenge. In the midst of all the upheaval we are experiencing, what a blessing this is—Thanks be to God!

As always, we hope you all remember that if you or your loved ones are experiencing difficulties, we are just a phone call away. No, we can't solve every problem for everyone, but perhaps we can help you work through some of the issues and ease your burden a bit.

Dear Fellow Members of New Life Lutheran Church,

Grace and peace to you in the name of God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We hope this letter finds you well in body, mind, and spirit.

These are unusual times that present us with some unique challenges. Most of these challenges center around how to be a community (a loving community) when gathering as a community is difficult, if not dangerous. The COVID-19 virus has changed our world and our daily routines. Even the Church has had to make adjustments. As a congregation, we have been limited to online worship and, more recently as restrictions have eased a bit, we have added a weekly drive-in parking lot worship service. Four plus months into this altered state we (we being pretty much the whole world) still have more questions than answers, and we have little idea of how long it will be before we can get back to our old "normal," if we can at all.

With the guideline adjustments coming from healthcare officials, scientists, and our government agencies, the New Life Lutheran Church Council was able to switch from online meetings to an in-person, socially-distanced council meeting Wednesday, July 8. This was our first in-person meeting in months. Of course, the biggest concern on everyone's mind was when and how can we gather again inside the church building for in-person worship. Even with the relaxed restrictions on number of attendees for faith community worship and activities, the Council Members expressed various levels of comfort in gathering and tolerance of the risks as we move toward the renewal of our indoor worship services. Following the recommendations of our NW MN Synod and the ELCA, the Council has appointed a "SMART Team" to study the latest government and healthcare guidelines, monitor the latest area updates on the Covid-19 virus, prepare the church building and the congregation for the still stringent requirements that need to be met in order to return to indoor worship and activities.

The SMART Team met Wednesday, July 15, to begin its work. The survey you should have received by mail last week is part of that work. We are asking you to fill out the survey in its paper form OR online on the New Life Lutheran Church Facebook page OR at newlifeparish.net by <u>August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020</u>. If you didn't receive this survey and would like one, please call the church office and we will make sure to get one to you. To return the paper survey to New Life feel free to place it in the offering bucket, bring it into the office (please wear a mask if you choose this option – part of those guidelines we are required to follow), or by mail. Please do take a few moments to complete the survey using only one platform. It will be incredibly helpful to the SMART Team, the Church Council, and the New Life staff.


### **Little Bethany Donations**

### **Applying Bible Principles**

Many people — including a significant number in our congregation — go through the exercise each December of making resolutions for the New Year. Some might even keep one or two of them. For the most part, though, New Year's resolutions are soon forgotten and discarded.

Regardless of whether or not we make New Year's resolutions, there is one resolution that each of us needs to make on a daily basis. It has to do with how we use our time. Jonathan Edwards is credited with this resolution which has two parts:

**Resolved,** to live with all my might while I do live.

**Resolved**, never to lose one moment of time, but to improve it in the most profitable way I can.

Stop and think for a moment. Think deep thoughts. If you knew that today were your last day on earth, what would you do differently? Or more specifically, would you make any changes in how you use your time — especially in serving the Lord here at Little Bethany & New Life Lutheran Churches — if you knew for certain that this was your last day?

Your honest answer to that question says a lot about you and your use of the time that God has entrusted to you. If you can honestly say that you would not change how you are using your time today, then perhaps you have indeed set your life and your priorities in proper order. If, however, you would make some changes in how you use your time if this were your last day, then perhaps those are changes you desperately need to make.

This little limerick is absolutely correct:

When as a child I laughed and wept, time crept. When as a youth I dreamed and talked, time walked. When I became a full-grown man, time ran. And later as I older grew, time flew. Soon I shall find while traveling on, time gone.

Jonathan Edwards also made this resolution:

**Resolved,** never to do anything which I should be afraid to do if it were the last hour of my life. Could you say the same thing? And more importantly, will you?

Or, as an unknown author put it so succinctly:

Only one life, 'twill soon be past.

Only what's done for Christ will last.
