Dear Fellow Members of New Life Lutheran Church,

The SMART team met on September 23rd to continue working on a plan to safely re-open the building so that all congregation members can feel safe when we do resume indoor worship.

At this meeting we continued work on a second survey to be sent out to the congregation. The survey's goal is to measure people's comfort with resuming indoor worship at the end of October. This survey will also include questions about resuming Sunday school. The survey will be mailed to all congregation members but you can also find it on our website at newlifeparish.net or on our Facebook page. Be on the lookout for this survey and return only one copy – either the paper copy or an electronic copy by October 10th. The paper copy can be mailed, dropped off at the church office, or placed in the offering bucket during our parking lot worship services on Sunday mornings.

Using the guidelines from the CDC and from the state of MN the committee has determined that we will need 5 to 7 volunteers per indoor worship service. The volunteers will be tasked with basic health screenings, recording names and contact information for each worshiper, and ushering worshipers in and out of the sanctuary. The SMART team is currently drafting a COVID-19 preparedness plan which is required by the state of MN before we can open. If you would like to review this draft and make any suggestions we anticipate that it will be available on October 7, 2020. It is an extensive document so, please call and reserve a copy prior to picking it up.

The SMART team is scheduled to meet again on October 14th to review the survey results. At that point we will determine whether it is best to continue with only parking lot and online worship services for now or to add an indoor worship service. If the SMART team and the NLLC Council move to resume an indoor worship service at the earliest convenience, we would anticipate the first service to be on Sunday, October 25, 2020.

It is vitally important for you to express your wishes and concerns on the Oct 1st - 10th survey.

Disclaimer: While no one will be turned away from the worship services due to age or susceptibility concerns, please note that 90% of COVID-19 and COVID-19 related deaths have occurred in the 55 and over age group. The state of MN and other health entities' guidelines strongly recommend people 65 and older consider not attending indoor, in-person worship services. While masking and social-distancing provide a safer environment than not masking and not social-distancing, it is still not considered entirely safe.

Current Guidelines to Re-opening

Given the current state guidelines, to resume in-person indoor worship services, the services will need to look and feel different. These differences include:

- Everyone will be required to wear a mask while indoors. Worship leaders will be allowed to unmask for presentations, but must remain 15 feet away from others while presenting.
- One way foot traffic in and out of the building
- Bring belongings to the pew with you and remove or put on jackets while in the pew.
- Volunteers will record names and contact information as you enter, so that we can trace contact if needed
- Volunteers will usher people in and out of the sanctuary
- Volunteers will be needed to ensure everyone complies with the guidelines (compliance officers)
- All interior doors, except restrooms, will be propped open
- No paper bulletins – to limit contact [bulletin will be projected on screen]
- Social distancing: using every other pew, 6+ feet between households, limit attendance to 85 people or less
- No singing of hymns [however possibly soloists with a safe distance of 15 feet from others]
- No responsive readings or prayers
- No passing of peace, no handshaking, no hugging
- No fellowship/coffee time before, during, or after services
- If you feel the need to bring your children outside of the sanctuary we ask that you go outside instead of lingering in the hallways – to limit contact.
- We ask that you remain in your pew during the service until ushered out; unless it is an emergency – to limit contact

“Investing for Time and Eternity” is the theme of this year’s annual stewardship emphasis. Be honest. When you first saw or heard this year’s theme, didn’t your thoughts immediately turn to money? After all, that’s what “investing” is all about. Right?

As we’ll see in various ways throughout this year’s program, “investing” **does** involve money. But it’s not limited to money. Investing also includes other resources that God has given to us, including time and talents.

Robert G. Lee, a well-known pastor for many years in Memphis, wrote,

If you had a bank that credited your account each morning with \$86,400 that carried no balance from day to day, allowed you to keep no cash in your account, and finally every evening canceled whatever part of the amount you had failed to use during the day, what would you do? Draw out every cent ... of course!

Well, you have such a bank, and its name is “Time.” Every morning, it credits you with 86,400 seconds. Every night it rules off ... as lost ... whatever of this you have failed to invest to good purpose. It carries no balances. It allows no overdrafts. Each day, the bank named “Time” opens a new account with you. Each night it burns the records of the day. If you fail to use the day’s deposits, the loss is yours.

In other words, when it comes to time, it’s use it or lose it! And how we use it determines whether it becomes an investment or is simply used up for this life only. Jesus said we are to seek first God’s kingdom and his righteousness. When we use our time to do that, when we make God’s work a priority in the use of our time, we are making a wise investment that will pay eternal dividends.

The same is true of the talents, gifts and abilities God has given us. We can figuratively bury them in the sand and refuse to use them in the Lord’s service. That’s what happens in many churches and even sometimes in this church. In most churches, regardless of size, 80% of the work is done by 20% of the people. One pastor expressed it so distinctly when he lamented, “As much we could use additional giving from God’s people, our greatest problem is not money. We just can’t get anybody to do anything.”

So “investing for time and eternity” includes how we use our “time” and “talents.” It also includes the use of our “treasure.” We are managers and stewards, not owners. God owns it all! When we give, we are simply giving back to God that which rightfully belongs to God.

In his excellent essay entitled, “Cost and Worth,” Chuck Swindoll wrote,

The difference between handling our money wisely or foolishly is largely determined by the interplay between these two forces. Obviously, we have spent wisely when the cost is eclipsed by the worth. . . . That is why, in the long run, we can usually determine a person’s scale of values by the things he or she purchases. Or to use the words of Jesus, “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

And then he concluded with this powerful presentation:

Think about Sundays ... your church life and the motivation you receive. Think about your children and their future. And their children’s future. Think about your neighborhood ... unreached individuals by the hundreds. Think about the possibilities of radio or television outreach, perhaps a Christian school, enlarged missionary outreaches, room to grow, room to park! What’s it worth? Deciding whether something is worth the cost requires intense, effective, prevailing prayer, as well as the hard work of objective thinking. And then it requires courage to act on God’s clear direction.

As you consider your time, your talents and your treasure, will you be one who is “investing for time and eternity” by courageously stepping out by faith in response to God’s direction in your life?

While the past few months have been challenging for all of us, we are blessed to have a God that loves us, and we are blessed to have each other. Finally, thank you. Whether you give a lot or a little, or offer your support through your time or your presence in worship and prayer, you are a valued part of our congregation and of God's creation. We are all in this together, and for that we can be thankful.

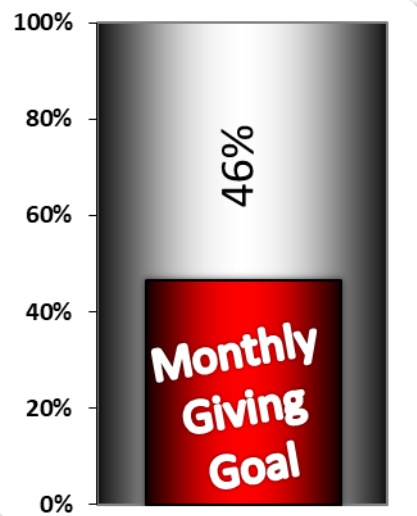
