Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our almighty and gracious God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

In a few days, Election Day 2020 will have come and gone. As one who is extremely tired of all the campaign ads, especially the negative ones, I will be in a state of Thanksgiving. I won't have to wait until this year's official Thanksgiving Day (November 26) to give thanks. That might not be the case for all of you...

With most every election there are winners and losers. Many of us have a lot of emotion riding on the results of this election. I have heard many people and various pundits say this is the most important election of our lifetime. I honestly don't know if this is the case or not. I think we'll have to wait for history to make that determination. What I do know, however, is that we have an incredible nation. It has weathered many trials and tribulations in its 244 years of existence. Some of those trials and tribulations, it seems to me, far overshadow what we are going through now—and we made it through as a nation. I think that is largely because we have been and are a nation of great and varied people. We are not all alike; we are distinctly different. We have come from different places, descended from different cultures. We look at things through different lenses, honed through different experiences. But as varied as we are, we all love this nation and the vision its founding documents cast before us. But the vision is not yet fully realized, is it? In many ways we are experiencing growing pains.

A few days ago I caught an intriguing interview on PBS. On the "Tell Me More" interview series, Kelly Corrigan was interviewing James Corden, the English actor, comedian, and current "Late Late Show" host on the CBS network. At one point she asked him, as a foreigner now living in America, what he thought of the current political landscape here in America. If that wasn't the set-up for a great joke, I don't know what is. But rather than making a joke he said, quite earnestly, that he'd recently seen a cornerstone on one of the oldest buildings at one of our oldest universities, and the building was only 254 years old. In Europe there are buildings over a thousand years old. Then he said to the interviewer something of this sort: "And I thought to myself, the United States is young as a nation. In comparison, it's just a teenager. It's still trying to find its way, discover itself. And you think of the angst, the rebellion, the indignation of a teenager, ... America is a teenager just going through that stage that we all go through."

I rather like that characterization. I don't mean to minimize the issues that are before us, but as a nation, still trying to find ourselves, we are going through some rather natural growing pains, still awkwardly trying to discover our true nature and work things out.

Regardless of the outcome of this election, I believe God will not abandon us. Even in our awkward, unruly stages, God will continue to be with us-as he is with all people, and the whole of his creation. As a nation, we'll still have our moments of enlightened greatness and fearful pettiness. Yes, we will still have to live with the painful consequences of our often abrasive, sometimes stupid actions, but that is part of growing up. This is how we find our way and learn to balance our independence with the proper and necessary level of dependence within a society or government or family system. This is how we learn to balance our God-given freedoms and the God-given, necessary responsibilities to allow us not just to survive, but to thrive.

Perhaps the greatest service we, as Christians and citizens, can provide ourselves and our communities, states, and nation as we prepare for this election day is to set aside all the political soundbites from the various political parties and candidates, open our Bibles, perhaps read through one or more of the gospels paying special attention to Jesus' parables, to discover again the depth of God's love for us: the hope he gives, the sacrifices he has made and continues to make for us, and the precious gift he gives us when he basically says, "Do as I do-love, . . . love one another."

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn. [Isaiah 61:1-2]

"I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." [Joshua 1:9]

The meeting opened with devotions from Mike.

1.0 Approval of Agenda: John made a motion to approve the amended agenda, Brenda seconded it, motion carried.

2.0 Approval of August 2020 Council Minutes: Steph made a motion to approve, Jessica seconded it, motion carried.

3.0 Treasurers Report: John made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, Steph seconded it, motion carried.

4.0 Ongoing Business

4.1 Constitutional update: We received a handout from John with a summary of some of the highlighted/suggested changes to the constitution. Once it is updated, he will have Pastor Randy and Patrice review it.

4.2 Smart Team update: Received handouts with the recommendations from the committee and also the results from the survey that was sent out. The recommendation from the committee is to look at a tentative date of November 29th due to the rise in cases around our surrounding area and the lack of a volunteer list to have indoor services. It was suggested for the Team to talk with the service group leaders and have them find volunteers for the new roles to have indoor services. They are also asking for money to purchase hands free hand sanitizing stations and hand sanitizer for the building before indoor worship resumes, foundation was going to discuss funding it at their next meeting.

(Council discussed all the information that was given to us and we decided to go with the recommendation from the Smart Team on waiting to open)

8.0 Office Manager's report: Lightspeed put batteries in the emergency lights. Marco Tech advisor, Crystal met with Patrice about upgrading the printer with and a new 5 year contract. Steph made a motion and Diane seconded it, motion carried depending on contingencies with upgrade. Had some network issued and got it fixed. Dealt with a marriage license issue and resolved it.

9.0 WELCA: Quilters have been meeting and will finish up the last week of October and will restart next year.

10.0 NLLC Foundation report: John has requests from the Smart Team for the purchasing of hand sanitizer stations. Request from WELCA.

11.0 Committee reports:

<u>Worship & Music –</u> No meeting but Diane reported they are continuing recording music and finding readers for worship services.

<u>Education</u> – Steph reported they met. No Sunday School, due to being closed and only one teacher. There is a lack of volunteers, they currently only have 2 teachers. Possible ideas include: story time with reading Bible verses or a facebook live Sunday School lessons. They are reaching out to other churches on what they are doing.

<u>Church Property</u> – Gayla reported she will fix a baseboard issue in the kitchen. Mike programmed the thermostats. Parking lot was discussed. Check on the lights in the parking lot.

Dear Fellow Members of New Life Lutheran Church,



The SMART team met on October 14th to discuss the current COVID-19 situation. The team made some changes to the COVID-19 preparedness plan and, after a long conversation about the current status of the COVID-19 pandemic in our area, it was decided to recommend to the New Life Council postponing our return to indoor worship_until November 29th. Some of the factors that went into this decision were: a large spike in COVID-19 cases in surrounding communities, high hospitalization numbers (which means less open beds and a severe lack of ICU beds), surrounding schools turning to distance learning due to positive cases within their student and staff populations. Also weighing on the minds of the SMART team were the results of the poll sent out to members at the beginning of October. Of the respondents, slightly less than 50% indicated they/their family was ready to return to indoor worship. In addition, only 6 individuals indicated they would be willing staff the volunteer positions (required by state guidelines) needed to facilitate the return to indoor worship. The SMART team believes the volunteer pool will need to increase significantly before we can schedule regular services.

While the SMART team is recommending this delay, the team also believes it is important to address the needs of those feeling isolated and who are ready to return now to indoor services. So, if there are groups or "pods" of people who are around each other on a regular basis who would like to gather together for a "pod" or family group worship service sometime during the week, Pastor Randy has volunteered to be available to lead such a service. If need be, such groups may meet in the sanctuary, if reserved in advance, and willing to adhere to church guidelines for meetings during COVID-19.

If you have a pod of people that would like to sign up for a date and time to worship please contact the church office at 218-867-6557 to get something set up. The SMART team is meeting again on November 12th to update things and work with service group coordinators to figure out a solution to the volunteer shortage. In the meantime, the team will continue working on better ways to make our facility safe, while acquiring the best supplies to help facilitate our return to indoor worship.

The NLLC Council met on November 21st and decided adopt the recommendation of the SMART team. At that meeting the SMART team requested funding for the purchasing of hands free hand sanitizing stations and hand sanitizer. The New Life Foundation Board will be working on fund such purchases.

The Council also decided that our Thanksgiving worship service, this year, will be incorporated into the Sunday, November 22, 10:00 am drive-in parking lot worship service. There will be no worship service on Wednesday evening November 25.

We continue to pray for your health and safety and are looking forward to the day we can all worship together again indoors. Please know we have the health of our congregation at the peak of our thoughts when making these decisions. If you have any comments or concerns please reach out and let us know.

All Saints Sunday is November 1, 2020. Please feel free to bring a lawn chair to sit outside, you can also bring an umbrella or canopy for shade.

Feel free to wave or yell "Hello" to others while practicing social distancing and maintaining 6 feet away from those not in your immediate household. Masks are not required but are encouraged if you are sitting outside of your vehicle. The Lord Jesus said, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume, and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" Matthew 6:19-21).

As managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to us, we have a responsibility to manage well what rightfully belongs to God. By storing up treasures in heaven, we safeguard that which we value. There, our treasures are not subject to destruction, damage or even inflation. Nor are they subject to theft since God provides the universe's greatest security system!

There's nothing wrong with saving or investing here on earth. In fact, Jesus gave a commendation to faithful stewards for that very action. But the primary place to invest is in what might be called "God's Eternal Bank." There are many ways to invest in that special "bank." When given in the name of the Lord Jesus and for His sake, even a cup of water can be an investment in God's Eternal Bank. Our financial resources can also be used in this way. Each time we give our tithes and offerings at our church for the glory of God, we are storing up treasure in heaven, "investing for time and eternity."

The universal principle of giving is found in 2 Corinthians 9:7 ... We are to give as we have decided in our hearts to give. In other words, giving (including when to give and how much to give) is a matter of the heart. It is the same principle Moses expressed in Exodus 25:2 ... We are to give willingly from the heart.

Dr. George W. Truett was invited to dinner in the home of a very wealthy man in his congregation. After the meal, the host led him to a place where they could get a good view of the surrounding area. Pointing to the oil wells punctuating the landscape, he boasted, "Twenty-five years ago I had nothing. Now, as far as you can see, it's all mine."

Looking in the opposite direction at his sprawling fields of grain, he said, "That's all mine." Turning east toward huge herds of cattle, he bragged, "They're all mine." Then pointing to the west and a beautiful forest, he exclaimed, "That, too, is all mine."




