Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Grace to you and peace in the name of God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

A famous rabbi and his friends had spent the entire morning working far from their village. The labor was difficult and dirty. At noon his friends brought a pail of water so their teacher could wash his hands thoroughly. To their surprise he used only a few drops of the water. How could it be that this pious Jew, a teacher no less, would skimp on the commandment to wash completely before eating?

Cautiously, one of his friends said, "Rabbi, you used so little water. It was not nearly enough to get your hands clean."

Wordlessly, the rabbi pointed to the young servant girl coming up the path from the distant well. She was bent low under a heavy bar laid across her shoulders. From the two ends of the bar hung massive pails of water.

Then he said, "How could I do the washing at the expense of this poor girl? The water I saved may well prevent another trip to the well for her."

Later the friends talked about the rabbi's action. They learned that in certain circumstances obedience to the commandments comes at the expense of others. And, they discerned from the actions of their wise friend, that lovingkindness is the greatest virtue residing at the heart of those commandments.

The story above is a retelling of an old Jewish folktale. The Jewish rabbis who relied on such folktales to help teach their students about their relationships with God and one another, taught that the well-being of the world rests on three things: the study of Scripture, prayer, and loving-kindness.

Some people, even today, would say that following God is a simple and easy matter. But, often it is not so simple. Seldom is it all that easy. Too often we take too much for granted. Seldom do we pause long enough to see that in this world of ours, so messy with sin, our actions and inactions have consequences that reverberate far beyond ourselves. And, if we fail to take these into account, they will have a way of coming back to haunt us, . . or our children and their children.

The thing is that whether or not we identify ourselves or previous generations as part of the cause of any injustices to us or anyone else, there are major problems, generational problems, that we have the opportunity to now address-as hard as they may be. And if we don't address them with honestly, integrity, and some self-sacrifice now, what heavier burdens will we be creating for our children and grandchildren?

I think, perhaps, those old Jewish rabbis have given us a pretty good place to start in addressing the well-being of our communities, our nation, and our world: the study of Scripture, prayer, and loving-kindness. Another Jewish rabbi from about 2,000 years ago put it another way when he was asked which is the greatest commandment. . . .

Jesus answered, "'Hear, O (people of God): the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

## **Indoor Worship**

## Little Bethany Lutheran Church simultaneous services at 8:45 am New Life Lutheran Church Sundays at 11:00 am

We appreciate your cooperation and willingness to follow the guidance provided to us from the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). Without everyone's compliance the indoor worship services will not be allowed to continue. Here are the practices that will allow us to have indoor worship:

- \*Masks must be worn at all times inside the building along with social distancing (maintaining 6 feet between household groups).
- \*Attendees will need to keep your coats and personal items with you as you enter the sanctuary and are seated.
- \*All people entering the building will need to sign in and provide a contact number. This is for contact tracing should the church be informed that someone attending has been diagnosed with COVID-19.
- \*Congregational singing will not be allowed due to added risk of the spread of COVID-19. We may incorporate some special music, but this will be very limited and highly regulated according to MDH guidelines.
- \*No food or beverages served, and no fellowship time, before, during or after the worship service.
- \*Offering plates will not be passed. Offerings can be dropped in the offering containers as you enter or leave the sanctuary.
- \* At NLLC at least 3 volunteer staff will be needed for each service. One to assist with the signing in process, one to direct people, one to serve as the Compliance Officer (the state mandated person charged with ensuring everyone in attendance is complying with the rules.

Please also note that MDH guidelines continue to discourage vulnerable people from attending indoor worship services even with the above precautions. Vulnerable people are defined as those 65 years old and older, and/or those with pre-existing conditions.

For all those uncomfortable with the higher risk of exposing yourselves or others to COVID-19 in such an indoor group setting, we will continue our drive-in, parking lot worship services at NLLC at 10 am each Sunday, and our online worship services.

Thank you for your continued patience and understanding in these challenging times!
