Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

John Powell wrote:

If I think of you as a friend and collaborator, my emotions on meeting you will be warm and positive. If I see you as an enemy and competitor, my emotions will be just the opposite. You will remember the little verse:

*Two men looked out from prison bars,
One saw mud, one saw stars.*

There can be no real change, no real growth in any of us until and unless our basic perception of reality, our vision, is changed.

Two hundred forty-five years ago our ancestors acted on a new vision of a new way to organize and govern themselves. They forged a new nation with incredible ideals of being a government and community of the people, by the people, and for the people. The vision was of a nation honoring, respecting, and empowering all people to live and thrive together.

Presently, when our nation, the United States of America, doesn't feel all that united, perhaps the most patriotic thing we can do to celebrate our birthday is to pause and recognize the gift of our diversity--the gift of so many lenses to see the world. Perhaps the greatest way to celebrate our birthday is to set aside our lenses, for a brief time, and truly converse with those of our friends who see with different lenses. Perhaps we can ask them to share with us the experiences that helped shape their lens on life. Perhaps through such conversations we can begin to appreciate one another. And, in the process, each of our visions can be readjusted so that we can live in harmony, that justice for all might prevail, and that this nation might greater live into its incredible ideals.

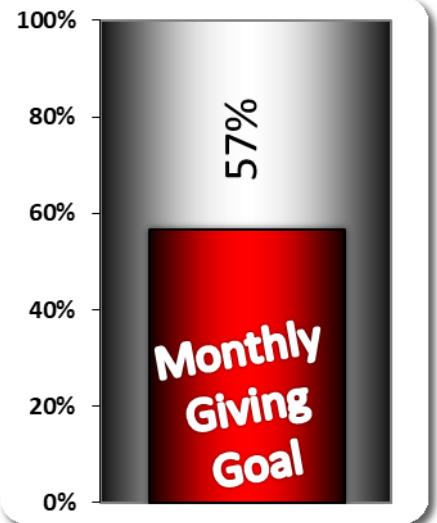

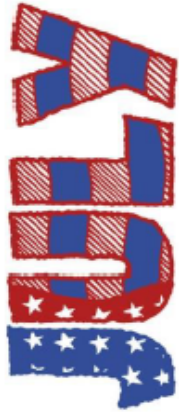
