Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.



During the Battle of the Wilderness in the Civil War, Union general John Sedgwick was inspecting his troops and their embattlements. At one point he came to a parapet, over which he gazed out in the direction of the enemy. His officers suggested that this was unwise and perhaps he ought to duck while passing the parapet. "Nonsense," snapped the general. "They couldn't hit an elephant at this dist--." At that very moment, before he could finish his sentence, General Sedgwick fell to the ground, fatally wounded by some Confederate soldier.

It was his own presumption, a faulty presumption as it turned out, that cost Union General John Sedgwick his life. In this world of ours, in the current political and cultural climates, I think too many people are presuming too much. We presume others are just wrong. We presume "they" get their information from compromised sources. Or, we presume "they" are just making it all up. We, on the other hand, presume "our" sources of information are above reproach. And, we assume the way we see things is the only truth. But, is that really the case?

Way too many of us, whatever side we may be on, presume way too much. And such presumption is costly, . . . perhaps even fatal, . . . not just for individuals, but maybe for our whole way of life.

So, if that be the case, what are we to do?

My grandmother Gertrude, who raised me since I was but a month old, only had an eighth- grade education. However, to this day, I think of her as one of the wisest individuals I have ever known. Why? Because it seems to me that for her, love trumped all things, in most all circumstances. In this, she reflected the wonder of God to me. I remember more than once, when I came home upset with someone about something or other, she would say to me, "Don't judge another until you've walked a mile in his moccasins." In other words, she was telling me, "Don't presume too much. Check things out thoroughly before you jump to conclusions. Perhaps things aren't as clear-cut as you presume. Perhaps there is good reason for what he or she said or did. You'll never know unless you try to walk a mile or two in his or her moccasins.

I'm afraid that too often, in the simple and arrogant mind of my youth, my reaction to her sage advice was, "Moccasins? Moccasin? Hey, moccasins are cool. Can I get a pair? Can I? Can I?," rather than the thoughtful consideration she intended for me to engage in. And, maybe, even in my adulthood, I have been just as mistaken and obstinate as I was then. And, I am guessing that I am not alone in this.

Sometimes, trying to walk in another person's moccasins means we have to call into question some of our dearest and closest held assumptions about ourselves and others, our patterns and histories and theirs. That's not an easy or comfortable thing. But, perhaps, it is the necessary thing above all others?

Jesus told this parable: "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? A disciple is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully qualified will be like the teacher. Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbor, 'Friend, let me take out the speck in your eye,' when you yourself do not see the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye."

This is food for thought from one probable hypocrite to another. God forgive us, one and all! And, may he grace us, as well, with the courage to walk a mile or two in one another's moccasins!
