Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,
Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator.
If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist.
If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist.
If our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer.
But our greatest need was forgiveness, so God sent us a Savior. [Source Unknown]

Though Jesus always was, he came to his creation in a new way somewhere around 2,025 years ago. The infinite and all-powerful became finite and vulnerable for us. He came in this profound way to save us from, essentially, ourselves and our wayward ways. He came to bring us Life, to give us something infinitely beyond mere existence—meaning and joyful purpose, life full and abundant. It is Life (with a capital L) that begins now and wondrously blossoms into its full beauty when the Light of his kingdom puts an end to all darkness.

This new way of coming to his creation began quite ignominiously with the birth of an illegitimate baby in, of all places, the darkness of a rustic stable, in a tiny and remote village, in no-account nation, at the outer edge of an empire that profoundly disrespected the people of this nation it conquered. Humble beginnings to say the least. Yet, if the birth of this Savior is seen as humble, how much more so was his death—not just humble, but shameful—hung naked on a cross to die for our sins!

As hard as all this is to believe, this is God’s way of doing business. It might not make sense to us, but it does make sense to him who is love itself. What we might see as disgraceful is full of grace. What we might see as foolish has fooled the greatest minds with its profound and life-changing wisdom.

“For while we were still weak, at the right time, Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.” [Romans 5:6-8]

“*At the right time*, Christ died for the ungodly.” God’s timing has always been and always will be impeccable. And his aim is the same-impeccable. It is to save those who cannot save themselves—which, in truth, is all of us. So, let us truly rejoice this Christmas in our Savior!

An angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!” [Luke 2:9-14]

So, my friends, once again, with the shepherds before us, “Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place!” [Luke 2:15b]

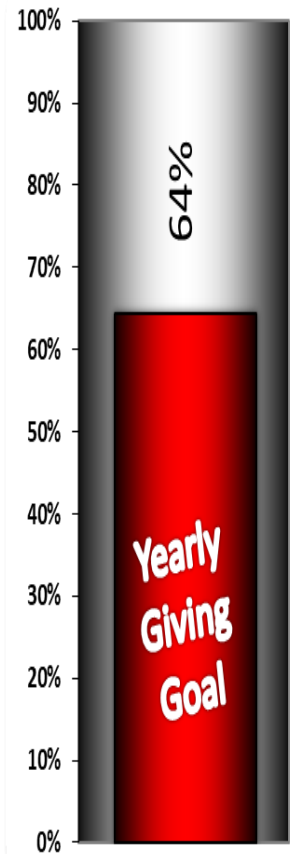

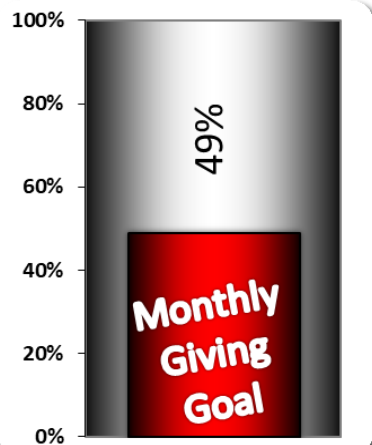

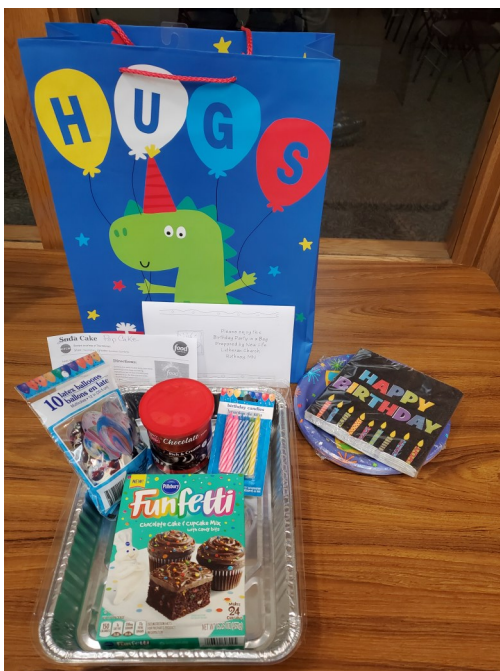
Donations can also be left at church Sunday mornings or during office hours.
