Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Grace to you and peace in the name of God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

In a box I was digging through yesterday I came across some old "Our Daily Bread" devotional booklets I had saved from my first parish. Two of the booklets had been jostled a bit and were creased open. When I picked the first I saw this devotion from Oct. 24, 1992:

George W. Truett, a well-known pastor, was invited to dinner in the home of a very wealthy man in Texas. After the meal, the host led him to a place where they could get a good view of the surrounding area.

Pointing to the oil wells punctuating the landscape, he boasted, "Twenty-five years ago I had nothing. Now, as far as you can see, it's all mine." Looking in the opposite direction at his sprawling fields of grain, he said, "That's all mine." Turning east toward huge herds of cattle, he bragged, "They're all mine." Then pointing to the west and a beautiful forest, he exclaimed, "That too is all mine."

He paused, expecting Dr. Truett to compliment him on his great success. Truett, however, placing one hand on the man's shoulder and pointing heavenward with the other, simply said, "How much do you have in that direction?" The man hung his head and confessed, "I never thought of that."

When I picked up the second booklet, it was creased open to the devotion for May 26, 1994. It read:

In the fifth century, a man named Arenius determined to live a holy life. So he abandoned the conforms of Egyptian society to follow an austere lifestyle in the desert. Yet whenever he visited the great city of Alexandria, he spent time wandering through its bazaars. Asked why, he explained that his heart rejoiced at the sight of all the things he didn't need.

Those of us who live in a society flooded with goods and gadgets need to ponder the example of that desert dweller. A typical supermarket in the United States in 1976 stocked 9,000 articles; today it carries 30,000. How many of them are absolutely essential? How many superfluous?

It's quite a contrast, don't you think? I can't help thinking about where I fit between those two extremes. I wonder: am I making the best use of the resources God has given me? Is there a good balance between my taking care of my family and myself and my investing in the mission of Christ—loving others (all others) as myself?

Perhaps we all need to ponder such questions more often than we do. As Dr. Truett asked looking heavenward, "How much do we have in that direction?"

COMPASSIONATE CARE BAGS

New Life Lutheran Church Community Care Committee has come up with a way for our members to take part in a project to show love and support for others in need. This Mission is to uplift and encourage our neighbors, friends, and family undergoing cancer and other long-term treatments.

We are asking for suggested items to be donated to be used to assemble Compassionate Care bags.

Each bag is assembled with items donated with love, encouragement and support. We hope to remind those undergoing long-term treatments that people they may have never met are sending their prayers, strength and positive thoughts. Monetary donations would be used to purchase items from the list if you care to help in that way. Checks could be made out to NLLC with 'Compassionate Care Bags' written in the memo line.

Below, we've created a list of items you may want to include in a compassionate care package. Of course, there may be something not mentioned here that they would find necessary or comforting. It never hurts to ask if your loved one has anything specific that they need, or to talk with their caregiver about what they may find helpful during this time.

- Devotional
- Chapstick (During the treatment process, a person's lips can become dry and cracked)
- Water Bottle (It's important to stay hydrated)
- Lemon drops/Hard candy (people often experience a dry or metallic taste in their mouths. Hard candy and gum minimize those effects)
- Unscented hand sanitizer
- Comfy socks
- Unscented hand lotion
- Journal/notepad ("There is research that says journaling has a positive impact on physical well-being and that regular journaling strengthens immune cells, called T-lymphocytes.")
- Pens/Colored pencils, something fun to write with
- Puzzle books/Brainteasers/Magazines/Coloring or activity book for adults (Great way to
 exercise the brain and support mental activities, plus a fun way to pass the time during treatment)
 (promote mindfulness, stress relief and relaxation)
- Pedometer (People are encouraged to walk during treatment to maintain bone strength and keep energy levels high, plus, walking releases endorphins to relieve pain and stress)
- Snacks
- Ginger snaps, Ginger chews, or Ginger Tea (For nausea)
- Handwritten note
- Prayer Shawl

Lastly, your family member or friend may really appreciate a handwritten note from you expressing your love and encouragement as they fight their disease. This shows them that you are thinking of them and that you are there for them.
