Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As I was driving to work the other day, I saw a flock of geese, in their characteristic "V" formation, flying quite low. Their trajectory was straight and true. I then noticed a group of smaller birds fluttering about, zig-zagging this way and that, arcing suddenly toward an intersection with the flock of geese. I assumed the two sets of birds were flying at different altitudes as neither group altered their flight path. As I watched, I discovered they were not flying at different altitudes, but the same, and there was an intersection in their flight paths. When it happened, the geese (the bigger birds) kept flying straight and true as the smaller birds intersected the middle of their formation. The smaller birds, realizing too late they were veering into the flock of geese, didn't hit any of the geese. A number of the smaller birds tumbled multiple times before they regained their bearings, regrouped, and continued on together in yet another different direction.

What intrigued me about what I saw was the determination and focus of those geese. The invasion of their formation by the other birds didn't seem to faze them one bit. None of them moved their heads or missed a beat of their wings trying to avoid a collision. No, they flew straight and true, keeping their eyes on their leader, keeping perfect pace, undistracted and unwavering. Needless to say, I was suitably impressed by those geese, their focus and determination.

I am envious of those geese. I wish I had such focus and determination. I wish I could keep my eyes, in a similar way, on my leader—God, who has come to us in human form in the person of Jesus the Christ. I wish the Church, in its many and various formations, had such focus and determination, as well.

Over and over again Jesus said, "Come, follow me." And, Jesus proceeded to cross many long-established boundaries, he proceeded to cast aside many tightly held traditions, making great and small sacrifices all along the way to make the truth of God's love and mercy known to all people. And he said, again, "Follow me." He never said to follow him would be easy. In fact, he went out of his way to tell people that following him would not always be easy, and it would require making sacrifices—sometimes great, sometimes small. *"If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."* [Mark 8:34]

What we soon discover when we choose to truly follow Jesus is that the sacrifices themselves are part of the journey—the journey to ultimate joy in, through, and with him. Truly following Jesus involves our time and talents, our relationships and resources.

As individuals, as families, and as the Church, are our eyes set on Jesus? Do we have the focus and determination to not let the many distractions and invasions deter us from our path and our task? Is our focus on "the mission"? Or, possibly, is it placed elsewhere?

Maybe, just maybe, it's something we should think about, and then talk about. What do you think?


