Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Back in 1968, if you had asked most anyone which nation would dominate the world of watchmaking throughout the rest of the century and into the 21st century, most everyone would have answered the same, "Switzerland, of course." Why would they have answered that way? Because Switzerland had dominated the world in watchmaking for the previous 60 years!

At that time the Swiss definitely made the best watches in the world. On top of this they were committed to constantly refining the technology in their watches. It was the Swiss who first came forward with the minute hand on their watches and then the second hand. They led the world in discovering better ways to manufacture the gears, bearings, and mainsprings of watches. They even led the way in waterproofing techniques and creating self-winding models. By 1968, the Swiss made 65 percent of all watches sold in the world. As such, they also laid claim to 90 percent of worldwide profits in watch sales. And, because the Swiss were so innovative, there was no reason to expect that anyone else would rival them any time in the near future.

But then, a man by the name of George W. Theiss invented a digital watch utilizing Quartz crystals. He took his design to Switzerland since they were the greatest watchmakers. He sought their backing for the manufacture of his new design. When the renowned Swiss watchmakers examined his invention, they said, "This isn't a watch. It doesn't have hands to tell time. It just has little numbers. You gotta have a big hand and a little hand to make a watch." Then, when they opened the back, they were even more negative. "This thing doesn't even have gears or springs or jewels. It's just a lot of electronic parts. This thing isn't a watch!" They wanted to have nothing to do with it.

Disappointed, but undeterred, Mr. Theiss took his revolutionary idea to Japan where he found industrialists who weren't so sure about what exactly made up a watch. Instead of rejecting Mr. Theiss' design, they agreed to manufacture it. Lo and behold, the watchmaking world was changed.

By 1980, the Swiss had laid off many thousands of watchmakers. At that time they controlled a mere 10 percent of the world market in watch sales. Why? Because the Swiss watch industry had refused to consider a new development—the Quartz movement—Mr. Theiss's invention. Because it had no main-spring or knob, it was rejected. It was too much of a paradigm shift for them to embrace. Seiko, on the other hand, accepted it and, along with a few other companies, became the world leader in the watch industry.

The lesson of the Swiss watchmakers is profound. A past that was so secure, so profitable, so dominant was destroyed by an unwillingness to consider the future. It was more than not being able to make predictions—it was an inability to rethink how they did business. Past success had blinded them to the importance of seeing the implications of the changing world and to admit that past accomplishment was no guarantee of future success.

As we enter a new year, 2024, I wonder if we Christians aren't in a similar situation as the Swiss watchmaking industry was back in the late 1960's and the 1970's. The world is changing around us. The question is, does our relatively secure and dominant past so blind us, that we fail to see that we need to adapt? Is our perception of "the way it always was" keeping us from addressing the true needs of our members and the world around us? What seemed to be working back then, doesn't seem to be working that well anymore.

We can, if we choose, take a "what must we do to adapt and remain relevant?" approach. Or, better yet, we can trust that God is still with us, and that the changes are simply an opportunity for us to open our eyes and ears and hearts to one another and to God's Spirit once again, and creatively address the challenges that God lovingly places before each generation to bring us all closer to God and to one another. It seems to me that where others might see only death, Jesus comes to bring new life!

Amazingly, "New Life" is the name these congregations of ours have chosen as their parish name. So, what do you say, New Life? Let's live into our name. Let's live into our God-given call. Let's live to bring new life to all we can through our relationship with God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and our relationships with one another.

"I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." [Joshua 1:9]




