Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

It's a rarity when Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day fall on the same day, as they do this year. In fact, after this year, the next time it is due to happen will be on February 14, 2086—62 years from now! Needless to say, I won't be around when it happens again. But, when it happens, what is a person of faith supposed to do? Do you celebrate Valentine's Day or observe Ash Wednesday? In the minds of most people, it would be hard doing both on the same day. As I heard one person say, "Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday have very different sentiments attached to them. One is about romance, the other is about sin, repentance, and reminding us of our mortality, . . .and death has a way of sucking the life out of romance.

Back in the year 2018, the last time Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday fell on the same day, a few days before it was due to happen, I was in a store and I overheard a couple people talking about the mash up of the two days, neither was happy about it. One complaining to the other said, "Why does the Church always have to push its agenda, always interfering, and now stealing Valentine's Day?" I smiled to myself as I passed by them, as for the briefest moment I considered stopping and mentioning to the two that both Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day began as relatively ancient Christian religious observances. Valentine's Day was set by the Church to commemorate the Christian martyr Saint Valentine (actually there were at least three Christians by the name of Valentine or Valentinus all of whom died as martyrs of the faith.) Ash Wednesday was set as the beginning of the 40 day period of Lent which was a time set aside for people to prepare themselves for the celebration of Easter. It was somewhere around the 13th to 15th century when St. Valentine's Day started to take on a romantic sentiments as cards and gifts began to be shared. And that sense of romance has grown since then, and perhaps has largely supplanted its religious origins and focus.

"Okay, thanks for the history lesson, but really, we don't care. What we want to know is which we should celebrate or observe this year."

My answer is . . . both, because both are important, and both are based in and on love. Because God first loved us, we can love each other. All three of those ancient Christians named Valentine/Valentinus who gave their lives in martyrdom did it out of love for others. The current ethos around Valentine's Day is romance which is based in love for another. That needs to be celebrated. Ash Wednesday, too, is about love. It's about calling us back to God who is love itself. It's about turning away from anything and everything that distracts us from the love we are being called into. That ashen cross we receive upon our skin may remind us of our mortality, that we will someday die, but it's also a reminder that death doesn't have the last word—God does. And that word is that death has been conquered by God who rose from the dead promising that we too will rise when we trust in him and his word of love.

One way to celebrate both is to separate the days. Who says that romance must be reserved for that one day? Who says that repentance can only be expressed on that one day. In a relationship, both of those should be a daily thing. Another way is to celebrate the two observances the same day, interpreting both as the expressions of love they have always been meant to be. So, all it really takes is a little creativity, and an abundance of love.

May your Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day be filled with meaning and loving! Take care and God bless!

Never Enough

A concert pianist one evening gave a stellar performance, receiving a standing ovation as the curtain fell. Afterwards, a reception was held in his honor. As the crowd gathered around him, one woman, who was a pretty good pianist in her own right, gushed, "Oh, I'd give

anything to play as you do!" The concert pianist looked at her and slowly replied, "No, I don't believe you would." A hush fell over the room. "Yes, I would," insisted the woman.

The pianist continued, "No, you really wouldn't. If you wanted to pay the price, you could play as well ... possibly even better than I. It has taken me seven or eight hours a day, seven days a week for at least seven years to play as well as I do. You would give anything to play as well as I do, except the time. When you say you would give anything, you don't really mean it."

Are we really willing to do whatever it takes to help? Or, do we sometimes think, "Enough is enough. No more help. No more for missions. No more time for the church. It has to stop!"

But as Jesus' actions make clear, enough is never enough. Jesus is filled with compassion (as we usually are too), and then he acts on that compassion by being willing to help. The willingness to help, however, must be reinforced by our doing whatever it takes to help others.


