Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

Kathryn Thornton is a scientist and educator, and a former NASA astronaut. She is a veteran of four space shuttle flights. In the foreword to a National Geographic book, she wrote about viewing the earth below from the shuttle orbiting high above. In the daylight passes, she said she and her fellow astronauts saw the churning motion of the oceans, the upheaval of the Himalayan mountain range in Asia, and made out many volcanoes, but saw little evidence of human activity. However, as they passed over to the night side of earth, they witnessed a very different perspective. . . .

On the night passes in orbit, evidence of human activity is abundantly clear. Densely populated landmasses are lit up brilliantly, whereas sparsely inhabited deserts are almost completely dark. Lights outline continents, particularly in the Northern Hemisphere, where people live along the coastlines. Strings of lights illuminate rivers and in some places, even highways, where densely populated towns and cities have grown up along these transportation arteries.

I think that many people, when they/we imagine God, tend to think of him as looking down on us from his heavenly perch high above. How accurate this image is in relation to reality; I don't profess to know. But let's work with this image for a moment. As I write this, I can't help but wonder what God sees when he looks down on us. More specifically I wonder what he sees in us--the Church. Is our activity as his followers, his representatives, his hands and feet and voice in this world as evident as say the clustering of lights witnessed by astronauts passing over the dark side of our planet Or, could it be that our activity, as his Church is so feeble and sporadic, that it just blends into the landscape, largely undetectable —as the human activity appeared to the astronauts on the bright side of the world?

As we are called upon by God, in Jesus, to let our light shine brightly, rather than hiding it under a bushel basket, it would be a terrible shame, a great tragedy to not be the light in this world.

Perhaps we all need to ask ourselves, "Am I just blending in, or am I, in my worship and prayers, in my kindness and acts of love letting God's light, his generosity and love shine through me?"

May this May be bright for us and for all.

Update on Port au Prince, Haiti

The situation in Port-au-Prince has not improved. Residents remain confined to their homes, schools remain closed, and major businesses operate at reduced capacity and hours. Moreover, food prices continue to skyrocket and become increasingly scarce, further burdening the exhausted Haitian population.

Despite the adversities, our students persist in their online education. Our dedicated teachers ensure minimal disruption to their learning amidst the chaos. Students maintain a rigorous schedule from 8 AM to 3:30 PM daily, engaging with lessons delivered via WhatsApp and Google Classroom. Additionally, parents visit the school to collect packets for students lacking internet access or smart devices.

These difficulties have significantly strained our budget, as we need to provide more resources to support our teachers in serving our students. Please pray for a change of heart among the gangs and leaders, bringing relief to the people who desperately need it.

We are grateful and delighted that our school in St. Michel has been operating at full capacity without any interruption since the chaos began in Port-au-Prince.

Prayer Request

The formation of an electoral council in Haiti continues to be delayed due to disagreements among proposed members. Without this council, the establishment of a transitional government remains elusive. Urgent prayers are needed for those in positions of power to resolve these disputes and establish the necessary structures swiftly. The lives of the Haitian people are at risk with each passing moment of instability and anarchy. May a resolution be reached soon to bring stability and safety to the nation.

Please continue to pray for the safety and well-being of our students, parents, and staff in Port-au-Prince.

New Life Lutheran Church Community Care Committee is bringing back the CARE Bags.

We are asking for monetary donations to be used to assemble the Compassionate Care Bags.

Each bag is assembled with items of love, encouragement and support.

We hope to remind those dealing with health crisis that we will be sending prayers for strength and courage.


