Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The New Life Lutheran Church Annual Meeting, this year, falls on Groundhog Day, a day on which the emergence of the groundhog from its burrow is said to forecast whether there will be an early Spring or not. Of course, the mention of Groundhog Day, brings to mind, for many of us, the 1990's movie by the same name, Groundhog Day. The movie is about a vain, self-absorbed television forecaster who reluctantly makes his way to Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, to report on and from the annual Groundhog Day festivities. As far as this weatherman is concerned, he can't get away from that "hick town" soon enough after he is done with his reporting. But rather than getting away from Punxsutawney, he gets snowed in there by a blizzard that he had forecasted wouldn't hit Punxsutawney. Most of the rest of the movie is about this weatherman waking up to the same day, everyday—Feb. 2, Groundhog Day. He's stuck in a time loop—where everything happens the same everyday. As the weatherman catches on to what is happening, he tries to use his foreknowledge of what occurs each day to manipulate things for his own advantage. Try as he might, though, he never manages to get his heart's ultimate desire. So, each day, sometimes in frustration, sometimes in excitement, sometimes in anger, sometimes in deep depression, he acts out, trying to change things, at times even killing himself in various ways. But always he wakes up the next day--to the same day. It isn't until he has done everything he could possibly imagine to escape the loop of the same day, and discovered that he can't, that he begins to truly take notice others. He sees that his foreknowledge allows him to be at the right place and the right time to help others, and he begins to do that. This doing for others brings about a change in him—he truly begins to enjoy life. But, he discovers that he can't help everyone. So, what does he do? He begins the long process of seeking the knowledge and training he needs to make a bigger impact on the lives of others. What the formerly self-absorbed weatherman discovers is that when his attention turns from himself to others, his life changes--he finds joy in each day and each relationship. In this new orientation in his life, he finds true purpose and meaning. That makes all the difference in the world, and he is at peace with his place in the world. And, you know what? Finally, the weatherman wakes up on a new day, Feb. 3, not Feb. 2, he is a new man, a changed man, and the world around him is changed for the better, as well.

Sometimes I think we, the church, are stuck in our own version of Groundhog Day. We're kind of stuck in a rut, a sort of time loop, in which we think the church today should look like the church of some golden time of the past. But, if we, the church, want to remain relevant, we can't stay the same. The world is changing, and we must as well.

Wasn't that what "The Reformation," five hundred years ago, was all about? The church had fallen into a rut in which its focus was, much more, on itself rather than on a world in need. Instead of setting captives free, the church was using fear to enslave them, and enrich the church hierarchy. Isn't that why Martin Luther and the other reformers insisted that the Church should always be "reforming" itself--to address the needs of a fallen world, and set captives free?

I think a lot of us are caught up in the vision that we must pull people back into the church (into the building and our present structure), for the sake of the church. The best research, however, is telling us otherwise. Instead, we need to find ways to take the Good News outside of the walls of our church buildings and into the lives of people who are "out there." We can't expect them to come to us. We must take Christ out to them. That happens through developing meaningful, transforming relationships-relationships that don't just transform them, but us. This is our challenge for a new day in the church. There are no promises that it will be easy and the process obvious. It means taking risks, becoming vulnerable, actively learning, purposefully growing, and realizing our bottom line is not our budget, but out mission.

Christ said our mission is to love one another—to love even those we deem unlovable, to be a light in the darkness, to bring hope where there is despair, to welcome the stranger, to care for the widow, the orphan, the needy. No, it will not be easy. It never has been. But, when we make this paradigm shift, allow Jesus' mindset to be our mindset, a new day will dawn.

Have a great Groundhog's Day, an awesome and happy Valentine's Day, and a terrifically blessed every day--all this February, . . . and each day after! Take care and God bless!


