Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I recently read the story of a man, now in his 60's, recalling from his childhood, the death of his somewhat reclusive grandfather. This grandfather was, in fact, this man's mother's step-father. When they went to visit Grandma, Grandpa Charles kept pretty much to himself, retiring to his private room—a room which Grandma couldn't even access. When Grandma had married Charles, he moved into her house and insisted he had this room completely to himself. "Even though it was Grandma's house," the man said, "to keep peace with her new husband, she agreed—and never went into the room again."

"When Grandpa died, and the family came together after the funeral to help Grandma take care of Grandpa's things," continued the man, "we all were anxious to enter Grandpa's private room which he always kept locked. We didn't know what to expect behind that door, but when we opened it, we were surprised to find but a simple small table, a sturdy chair, and many, many boxes, all covered with dust.

When the family opened the boxes, they were blown away by what they found—stacks and stacks of money and many and various stock portfolios! It turn's out that that man's Grandpa and Grandma were rich, and she never knew it before that day. "I can't believe it," his grandmother exclaimed. "I thought we were poor. I scrimped and saved and went without so many things, but now to find out there was always plenty of money. I can't believe it." She was devastated.

The grandson, now grown and gray, said, "We all felt excited for Grandma—that now she had ample funds to do whatever she wanted, but also sad and very sorry that she didn't have such funds earlier. Because of Grandpa's apparent greed and selfishness, both he and Grandma suffered needlessly. That was a very powerful lesson for me. Now I see that sometimes we all let greed and selfishness get the best of us. And, because of it, we all suffer needlessly, and way too often."

Maybe we all can learn from this man's story. The truth is, our bodies and our souls, our talents and abilities, our gifts of every kind, and our very lives really belong to God—from whom all of these good things have come in the first place. Yet, we sometimes, and way too often, want to and try to keep a part of ourselves and our lives for ourselves—we don't want God to have it. The result is that we and those around us suffer needlessly.

The Apostle Paul, in Romans, chapter 6, tells us we need to give our whole selves, our whole lives to God. In this, Jesus tells us in so many ways, we will find our greatest joy and fulfillment.

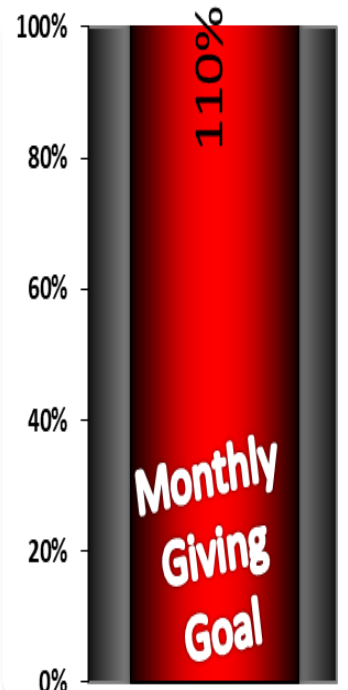
