Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Amanda, a 16-year-old girl, was driving one evening with friends, when she accidentally backed into a light pole. She didn't hit it hard, but it was enough to snap the pole, which came crashing down on the car. A 12-year-old friend in the car had been severely injured; in fact, she was brain-dead when she arrived at the hospital. A hospital chaplain-in-training, by the name of Michael, worked with the 12-year-old's family as they went through the heart-wrenching process of realizing the truth about her condition and allowing the life support to be removed from her body.

The following morning, Michael visited Amanda, the driver, in her hospital room. Physically, she was recovering well, but emotionally, she was distraught knowing that her actions had killed her friend. She told Michael, "I'm going to be like a daughter to her parents. I'm going to go over to their house every day and baby-sit for them. I'll wash their dishes for them every night. I'll go over every weekend and mow their lawn." On and on she went. But Michael gradually helped her realize the truth that no matter what she did, she could never replace their daughter. She could never do enough to make up for her actions. All she could do is ask for forgiveness and hope that her friend's parents would find it in their hearts to forgive her.

The parents who lost their daughter did forgive Amanda. She was set free from trying to pay back a debt she could never repay no matter what she did.

In a way, Amanda's story is very much like ours. God has created each of us and has blessed each of us differently, but always, incredibly. And all God has asked of us is to trust in him and love one another. But, despite the best of our intentions, we haven't always trusted in him and loved one another. In fact, we have sinned greatly—so much so that we could never do enough to make up for it.

Amazingly, incredibly, however, God himself has breached the gap between us and him. He suffered and died on a cross to show us forgiveness and set us free from trying to pay back a debt we can never repay no matter what we do. Thanks be to God!

While we can never repay God, God hopes we do not take the freedom he offers as a license to sit aside and do nothing, or to continue to make poor choices in our relationship with him and in our relationships with others. Because what we do or don't do still has consequences for us, for our families, and for so many others who surround us. We can stive to show them the freeing forgiveness and the awesome presence and guidance Christ Jesus offers, or we can abandon them to the winds of an often stormy, self-obsessed world. One option offers peace, even in turmoil; the other, anything but. "One's philosophy is not best expressed in words. It is expressed in the choices one makes. In the long run, we shape our lives and we shape ourselves. The process never ends until we die. And the choices we make are ultimately our responsibility." [Eleanor Roosevelt]

As our schedules adjust to the changing seasons, I pray we all keep or move our relationships with God at or to the very center. I wish you all a super September and a delightful Fall season!

Stewardship (Steph Curtis):


- The committee met on July 27th to discuss the current budget and plan for the 2026 campaign.




