

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. [Luke 2:10-11]

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

There's the story of a little boy who decided to write a letter to God one Christmas. He started out by writing: "Dear God, I've been a really good boy this year." As he finished that sentence, however, he remembered that God was all knowing and all seeing. So, he crumpled up the paper he was writing on and threw it away. He figured God would know that was a lie.

He pulled out a second sheet of paper and started writing. This time he wrote: "Dear God, I know I haven't done everything I should have, but I really tried to be good." Again, he stopped, crumpled up the paper, and threw it away. It was obvious that he was struggling with what to write

to God.

As the boy sat there thinking about it, he looked up and his eyes fell upon the nativity set his mother had set up for Christmas. That nativity set, with the baby Jesus in the manger, Mary and Joseph hovering over him in the stable, and shepherds, wise men, angels, and various animals surrounding the stable, was is mother's favorite Christmas decoration. It was then that the boy had an idea. He got up, ran out of the room, and returned with a small towel and a shoe box. He quietly walked over to the nativity display, looked around. Seeing no one, he tenderly picked up the Mary figurine, wrapped her in the towel, and carefully put her in the shoebox. He then hid the shoebox in his bedroom closet. At that point he returned to the table, pulled out a fresh piece of paper, and

began to write: "Dear God, if you ever want to see your mother again . . . .

We chuckle at this, but it seems as though, every year, the greater part of our modern society does something similar. It tries to take the Christmas season, the Christmas story, hostage, with its multiplicity of gadgets and must have toys, it's dizzying schedule of parties and expectations, and the ever-building pressure to make sure this Christmas is a seamless and perfect holiday. The world tries to make demands and hold Christmas for ransom--to make Christmas about anything and everything other than God's physical entry into the brokenness of this world. He came as an innocent and vulnerable baby—a baby who, ultimately, grow up to reclaim as his own, including you and me . . . as he ascended a cross, suffering and dying for our sins, . . . but also rising from the dead to conquer death so that we can live fully and vibrantly, fearlessly and generously not just at Christmas, but at every moment of every day of every year.

While our modern society tries to take Christmas hostage, it can't, not really. The Christ child,

his story, which is our story, is just too powerful, too life changing.

The wayward world's response to this is to try to take us hostage. Sometimes, it happens—but only when we take our eyes off Jesus, only when we allow the noise of the world to fill our ears

tuning out Jesus' words, his calm, steady voice.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, amidst all the hubbub of the world's artificial, un-sustaining version of Christmas, perhaps our greatest prayer for ourselves, for one another, and for the world is a prayer that the sights and sounds, the reunions and remembrances we choose this season might all be centered around the true meaning of Christmas--the birth of the Christ child, whose very presence makes the glitter of our Christmas decorations and presents pale in comparison.


